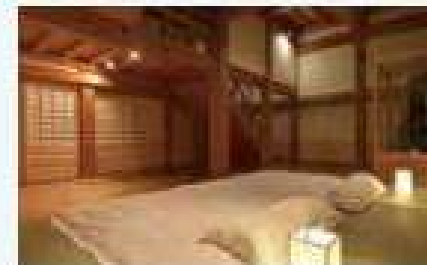


Stay like a daimyo for a mere ¥1 million
Rent this castle as your own personal hotel
Ozu Castle

Those who really want to be immersed in the world of Japanese history should check out Ozu Castle in Ehime Prefecture, where visitors—for a price—can stay in luxury.

Hijikawa River flows through the center of the town, so it has flourished as a hub of ocean shipping since ancient times. Oozu Castle, which uses the Hijikawa River as its moat, is the best example of master craftsmanship in castles. Unfortunately, much of the castle was destroyed after the Meiji Restoration (1868). But it was masterfully restored by local volunteers.

The “Castle Stay” plan allows visitors to reserve the entire castle for their stay and enjoy luxurious Japanese cuisine in the important cultural property Garyu-sanso, watch traditional Japanese performances, and even wear kimono and armor. You’ll feel like you own the place! It is pricey—¥1 million per night for two guests—but it is surely the experience of a lifetime.
